




R.W. "Bob" Alley






"I am busily at work on my debut picture book with Neal Porter Books/Holiday House. I'm particularly interested in projects that deal with themes of nature, animals, and home."

"I really enjoy delving into history and its unique untold stories."



Matt Faulkner



"I'm interested in picture books (both fiction and nonfiction), poetry collections, and covers for middle grade and YA. I'm ready for something new to get my hands and heart into!"


















John Sandford






